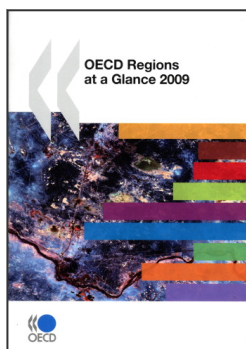


## Symbols and Abbreviations

<b>Country average</b>	Average value over regional data
<b>OECD total</b>	Sum of all the OECD country regions. Since Luxembourg presents no regions, OECD total excludes Luxembourg
<b>OECD# total</b>	Sum of all OECD country regions where regional data are available (# number of countries included in the sum)
<b>OECD average</b>	Average over OECD country regions
<b>OECD# average</b>	Average over OECD country regions where regional data are available (# number of countries included in the sum)
<b>TL2</b>	Territorial level 2
<b>TL3</b>	Territorial level 3
<b>Australia (TL2)</b>	TL2 regions of Australia
<b>PU</b>	Predominantly urban (region)
<b>IN</b>	Intermediate (region)
<b>PR</b>	Predominantly rural (region)
<b>NOG</b>	Non-official grid
<b>Australia (NOG)</b>	Non-official grid regions of Australia
<b>PPP</b>	Purchasing power parity
<b>USD</b>	United States dollar
<b>HTM</b>	High-technology manufacturing
<b>KIS</b>	Knowledge-intensive services
<b>LFS</b>	Labour Force Survey
<b>PCT</b>	Patent Co-operation Treaty
